## Message From the Board

A few friendly reminders as the fall season rolls upon us, as well as news items to share with the residents:

**YARD WASTE** | Remove leaves from your yard, along with garbage and items that should not be stored outside of your home or garage and put yard waste bags, garbage, and recycling containers to the curb no earlier than the evening before pickup. From the city’s website about yard waste collection:

*“From Nov. 4 through Dec. 13, 2024, the City offers a free bagged yard waste collection program. During this time, homeowners may dispose of yard waste in 32-gallon paper yard waste bags or clearly labeled cans (Yard Waste Only) or carts, free of charge, each week on their regular garbage and recycling collection day. Branches and other yard waste that are tied into bundles require a sticker at all times. Prior to Nov. 4, a yard waste sticker is required on all bundled or bagged leaves and yard waste placed out for collection.”* Scan for more.



**YOGA CLASSES** | Thank you everyone who attended the summer yoga series! Based on the feedback received, Jen and April (organizers) are looking to create a winter series to be held at an actual yoga studio (360 Studios) to allow for more people to attend. **YARD SIGNS** | We would like to remind all our residents about yard signs (from the HOA rules): “No commercial sign of any kind shall be erected or displayed on any lot in Breckenridge Estates, except that “For Sale” or “For Rent” signs shall be permitted so long as there shall be no more than one (1) “For Sale” or “For Rent” sign on any lot and any such sign shall comply with all legal requirements of the appropriate governmental authority. Security signs denoting security systems will be allowed as long as they are 80 square inches or less in size and placed within ten (10) feet of any dwelling unit. Noncommercial signs greater than 20 square feet may not be displayed for more than 90 cumulative days in a calendar year.” **We also ask that homeowners do not put up Election signs any sooner than 30 days before the election, 1 sign per candidate, and please remove the signs promptly after the election.**

**TREE LOSSES DURING RECENT STORMS** | There are many of us that lost trees in the recent storm. The City of Naperville’s replacement of Parkway Trees program is available for those who qualify. There are rules related to replacement: The 50/50 cost share program is available to residents who have had a parkway tree removed within the past 12 months along the frontage of their property and provides one replacement tree for each that was removed in the past year, if there is space. In addition, the site lists tree species available. Let’s all work together and continue to keep Breckenridge Estates a beautiful community! Scan code for more.

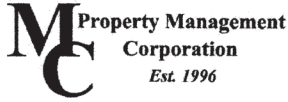

# SENIOR SAFETY

Did you know scams targeting people over the age of 60 caused more than \$3.4 billion in losses nationwide in 2023? That's an increase of approximately 11% from the prior year, according to the FBI's Elder Fraud Report. Protect yourself and your loved ones by delving into this month's Safer Naper topic: Senior Safety.

Common scams currently targeting the over-60 age group include imposter scams, online shopping, sweepstakes, lotteries, investments, and business and job opportunities.

With all the complicated scams out there that are constantly evolving, it's important for older adults and their families to stay diligent by learning what scams are out there, how to recognize them, and most importantly, how to avoid falling for them.

This month's Safer Naper campaign will help educate you in these areas, including how to recognize the signs of a scam:

- Pressure to act immediately.
- Pressure to keep information secret.
- Scare tactics.
- Requests for sensitive or personal information.
- Demands for money, typically in a form that is difficult to recover, such as cash, wire transfer, gift card, pay app or cryptocurrency.
- Specific instructions on how to make the financial transaction. These may include a demand to stay on the phone line with the caller while making payment arrangements.

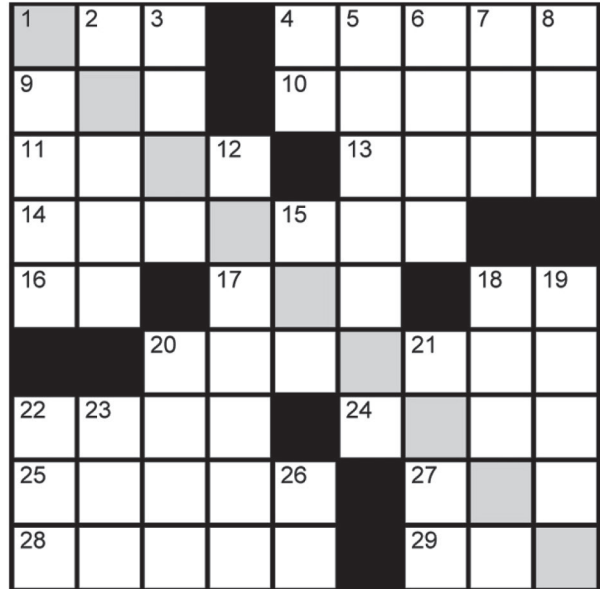

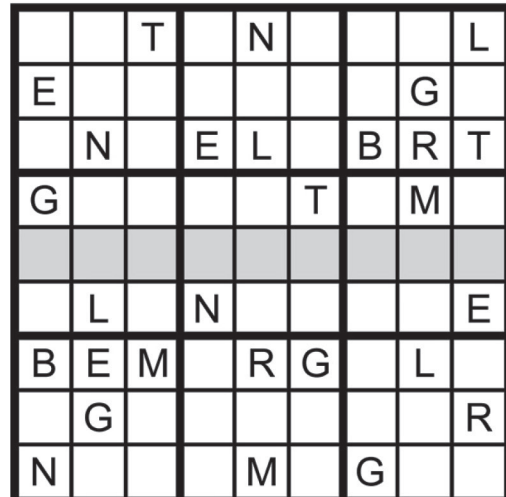

## September Wordoku

### How to solve wordoku puzzles

You only need logic and patience to solve a wordoku. Simply make sure that each 3x3 square region has only one letter from the word TREMBLING. Similarly, each letter can only appear once in a column or row in

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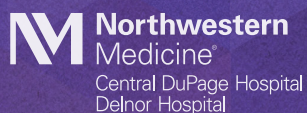


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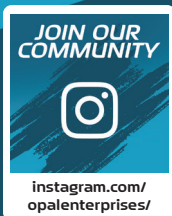
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
